

For most domestic flights in 2025, Delta's fees are:

First Checked Bag: \$35Second Checked Bag: \$45

Is Delta Airlines Charging for Carry-On Bags Now?

Delta Airlines Charging for Unaccompanied Minors - Updated 2025 Policy

Yes, Delta charges a \$150 fee each way for the Unaccompanied Minor (UM) program. This service is mandatory for children ages 5-14 traveling alone and includes a Delta escort and access to kids-only Sky Zones at major hubs. This booking must be made by calling +1(888)-241-1165.
